

ARCHAMBAULT (CONT.)

December he cedes his land to Pierre Dardenne (Same Registers). Aged more than 60 years he feels again the need of companionship. On the 26th of January 1666, before the Notary Ameau, of Three Rivers, he solemnly contracts to marry Marie Denot, native of Porcheresse, Charente, (France), widow of Mathieu Labat, Sir du Bourgo; then widow of Louis Ozannes. The act of marriage, which took place at Cap, is lost. Always esteemed at Montreal, Archambault figures in the number of the 29 notables on 15th of May 1672 who govern through the election of a trustee (Cf. Faillon, Hist., III, 3625). He died at Montreal, 84 years of age, and was buried the 15th of February 1688. His children were:

1. Denis: baptised in Dompierre (D) 12 September 1630; died and was buried at Montreal (M) the 26th of July 1651 having been killed in combat by the explosion of a canon which he was firing for the third time. (Cf. Jesuit Relations, ed. by R.G. Thwaites, Vol. 36, p. 137; Faillon, Histoire, II, pp. 126-127); an inventory of his clothes was made by Closse, 21 January 1652.
2. Anne Archambault: born about 163k; married for the first time at Quebec (Q) to Michel Chauvin; this marriage was annulled because Chauvin had then a wife in France. She married a second time at Montreal 3 February 1654 to Jean Gervaise; will made 26 November 1693 (Adhemar's registers); buried at Montreal 30 July 1699.
3. Jacquette: born about 1632; married Q 28 September 1648 (cf. Badeau, 26 Feb. 1656) to Paul Chalifou; buried Q 17 December 1700.
4. Marie Archambault: b. D 24 February 1636; m. Q 20 September 1648 to Urbain Tessier; buried at Pointe aux Trembles, Montreal 16 August 1719. (Not an ancestress)
5. Louise: baptised D 18 March 1640; buried....
6. Laurent: baptise D 10 January 1642; m. 7 January 1660 (M); buried....
7. Marie Archambault: born about 1644; married Montreal 27 November 1656 to Gilles Lauzon; buried Montreal 8 August 1685.

Etymology: Germanic name from Arcan meaning natural, indigenous; and Bald, bold, audacious (Cf. Dauzat, Les Noms de Famille, p. 75). On this family, see L. Lauzon, OMI, Gilles Lauzon et Sa Postérité; Rev. L.M. Archambault, Genealogie de la Famille Archambault.

ARRIVE

Arrive, Jacques (il signait "Jacque Arrive"; BRH, 15, 19) dit de l'Isle, fils de Pierre et de Jeanne Rosier, epousa a Ars-en-Re (Charente-Maritime) le 22 juillet 1663, Renee De la Porte (Devenu Desportes au Canada), fille de Jacques (De la Porte) et de Esther Coindriau. Cette dernier, native de St. Pierre d'Obin (Char.-Maritime), etait fille de Daniel Coindriau et de Jeanne Tesmier. Le couple ne tarda pas a partir pour le Canada en compagnie d'Esther Coindriau et de Marie De la Porte, sa derniere fille suivante. Au Canada, Jacques Arrive recut des Jesuites une concession a Sillery, le 1er octobre 1665 (gr. Vachon). C'est la que le trouve le recensement de 1666 (ed. Roy, 97): "Jacques Arrive, 26 ans, chandelier, habitant, Renee de la porte, 24 ans, sa femme, Louise Arrive, 6 mois, fille"; le recensment de 1667 place notre colon a la cote de Notre Dame des Anges entre Montauban (Jean Galoup) et Jacques Hudes: "Jacques Arrive, 27 ans, Renee Desportes, 26, Louise, 2, Jeanne, 6 mois; 4 arpents en valeur" (Sulte, Histoire, IV, 68a). L'inventaire de Jacques Arrive dit de L'Isle, decede, et de Renee de la porte fut fait le 17 aout 1673 par le notaire Becquet. La veuve convola en secondes noces a Quebec le 29 Janvier 1674 avec Michel Berthelot Du Veau dit Descormiers. La
