

ARRIVE (CONT.)

presented a request to the Sovereign Council to take away her power in the community of effects with the deceased Arrive; her petition was dismissed (14 April and 15 September 1674, Judgements and Deliberations, Vol. 1, pp. 804, 835). The census of 1681 finds the family Arrive at Dombourg on the farm of Michel Duneau between Louis Delisle and Etienne Poivillon: "Michel Duneau, 38 years; Renee Desportes (sic), his wife, 38; children: Louise, 16; Marie, 15; Jeanne, 14; Madeleine, 12; Jacques, 10; Marie, 2; Michel and Marie, -6 months; 2 guns; 7 horned beasts; 20 arpents cleared". "Marie, 15 years" is an error on the census taker's part; the last three children are of Renee de la Porte's second marriage. A storm of misfortunes comes upon the family in 1682 (Jug. et del. Vol. II, pp. 814, 831, 836, and Inv. Coll., n. 155). Renee de la Porte was buried at Montreal under the name of Renee Descormiers, the surname acquired by her second marriage, on 6 May 1705. The Children of Jacques Arrive and Renee de la Porte were:

1. Claude-Louise: bapt. Quebec (Q) 7 August 1665; m. Montreal (M) 23 November 1682 (cf. Mauge, 13 October) to Jacques Cardinal; buried (M) 14 September 1744.
2. Jeanne: bapt. Q 3 April 1667; m. Pointe aux Trembles, Quebec (PTQ) 21 February 1689 to Jean Chesnier, widower of Marie-Genevieve Ferret; buried....
3. Marie-Madeleine Arrive: born at Cote de Beauport; bapt. Q 20 January 1669; m. (PTQ) 15 January 1688 (cf. Normandin, 3 January) to Jean Dionet (or Guyonnet); married a second time at (M) 15 January 1720 (cf. Raimbault, 29 December 1719) to Jean Fontenelle, royal carpenter, son of Francois (Fontenelle), amaster-carpenter, and Françoise Loupy(?) de Carnay, diocesis of Reims, in Champagne; buried (M) 27 July 1755.
4. Jacques: bapt. Q 7 March 1671; made a trip to the Ottawas in 1694 and again in 1717; married Barbe Ferrin at Lachine 31 December 1696; captain of the militia; died 22 July 1732 at Soulanges.
5. Andre: contributed with Jacques, Louise, et Marie-Madeleine to the trip of their sister Jeanne to France, 4 October 1696 (cf. records of Notary Mauge); buried...

Jacques Arrive, the elder, was surnamed "de l'Isle" because he came from the Ile-de-Re. Descormiers is the surname of the second husband of Renee de la Porte.

AUNOIS

Auneau, Jeanne (Variations: Aunos (gr. Adhemar, 9 oct. 1684); Naunau (reg. de Trois Rivières, 12 janv. 1647, etc.); Aunois, (rec. 1666);) femme de Pierre Lefebvre, a pour premier enfant Jacques, baptise aux Trois Rivières le 12 janvier 1647. D'origine inconnu, elle serait nee en 1621 d'après le recensement de 1666 (ed. Roy, 149); en 1626 d'après celui de 1667 (Sulte, Histoire, IV, 69b); en 1627, d'après celui 1681 (Sulte, Histoire, V, 63c). Le 13 avril 1663 (gr. Aneau) Pierre Lefebvre et sa femme se faisaient donation mutuelle. Le mari testa le 16 juillet 1668; (gr. Aneau); a sa maison du Cap de la Madeleine, et mourut peu apres. Le 20 janvier 1671, Jeanne "Aunois" faisait donation a ses enfants de tous ses biens meubles et immeubles; il y ecrit pourtant partage entre Jeanne "Aunos" et ses enfants le 9 octobre 1684 (gr. Adhemar). Elle fut inhumee aux Trois Rivières, le 11 fevrier 1697.
