3. Gabrielle: bapt. M 23 Dec. 1673; m. 1^o L 9 April 1687 (cf. Pottier, 8 Apr.); to Jean Vincent; 2^o L 18 Nov. 1698 (cf. Pottier, 18 Nov.) to Leonard Laland dit Letreille; buried....
4. Jean: bapt. L 12 Apr. 1676; M. L 9 Feb. 1705 (c. LePailleur, 6 Feb.) to Louise-Madeleine Merlot; buried....
5. Marie-Anne: bapt L 27 Nov, 1678; m. 1^o L 4 Nov. 1698 (cf. Pottier, 3 Nov.) to Francois Lory; 2^o Detroit 12 June 1710 to Martin Cirier; buried....
6. Marie-Madeleine: bapt. L 7 April 1681; buried L 17 October 1687.
7. Albert: bapt. L 19 Sept. 1683; hired to go to Detroit 10 July 1703 and and 28 July 1704 (Adhemars records); M. 1^o M 24 Nov. 1710 (cf. Adhemar, 24 Nov) to Jeanne Bousquet; 2^o M 5 October 1717 (cf. Adhemar, 3 Oct.) to Marie-Anne Ferron-Sancerre; buried....
8. Antoine-Francois: bapt. L 5 May 1686; m. (cf. sspr. Lachine, 23 May 1711) to Marie-Anne Lalande, who later espoused at Ste*Anne, Montreal 25 October 1734 Charles Parent; buried Boutde l'Isle, Montreal 17 Sept. 1733.

Variants: Baune, Bosne, Bone, (census of 1681), Bonne (Tanguay, VI, 52).

Etymology: Beaune or Baulne, Beaulne, names derived from "Belenus" , native god of Gaul from whome the names of several towns are derived and, hence, the names of several families (Longnon, Noms de lieu, no. 464).
